• Support Features

SSO support is provided in classes or through withdrawal in small groups and sometimes 1:1, during Literacy and Numeracy lessons over the week. Additional support is provided by support services. The school works collaboratively with NDIS providers and supports their access to clients during school hours.

Teaching Methodology/Curriculum

Our teachers use the Australian Curriculum and teach across all of the 8 learning areas.

Junior Primary Students access the Initial Lit program from Reception to Year 2 to develop their phonic knowledge, spelling and reading skills.

Teachers implement the Child Protection Curriculum and Friendly Schools Plus across all year levels.

Assessment Procedures and Reporting

Interview with all parents in Term 1 with a focus on literacy, numeracy and social development, detailed written report in all areas of study in Term 2. Optional Interviews in Term 3 and detailed written report in Term 4.

5. Sporting Activities

- School netball and cricket teams and SAPSASA participation. The school supports local hockey, soccer, football, basketball and tennis teams.
- School pool is used by all classes in appropriate weather.
- Sports Day held annually. The school has at present three school houses Tarcoola (blue), Kulkyne (red) and Ontario (yellow).

9. School Facilities

Buildings and Grounds

The school community has continued to support the school in developing the grounds and buildings including the swimming pool, barbecue area, computer room, playground and garden areas. In 2021 a nature play area was developed near the school oval. School buildings include one unit (three classrooms, Computer Room and administration area), four single transportable classrooms, a solid brick staffroom, a resource centre, a small canteen and a disabled toilet. A Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA), Multipurpose Hall, Learning Support Area are part of the shared spaces available for learning. The Learning Support Area is set up with Teacher Resources, Literacy and Numeracy Resources. SSOs use this area when working with students either individually or small groups. A staff preparation area is also in the staff room with computer access and photocopier.

Cooling

All buildings have ducted reverse cycle air conditioners.
